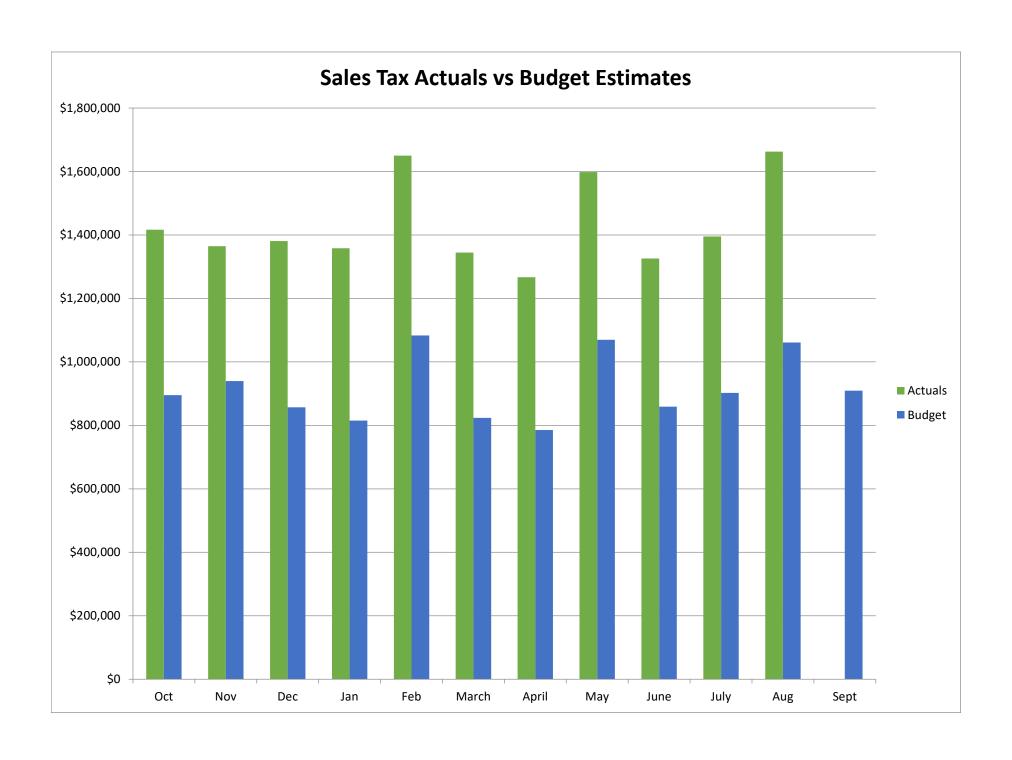

Sales Tax Variance

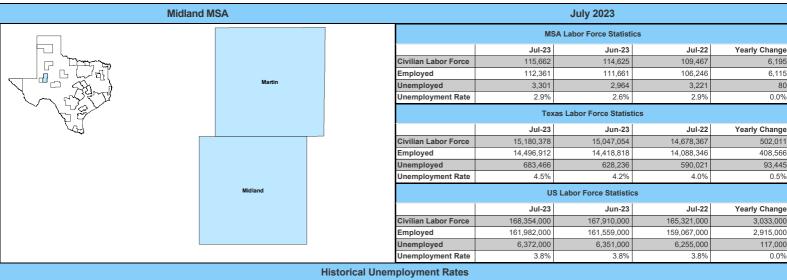

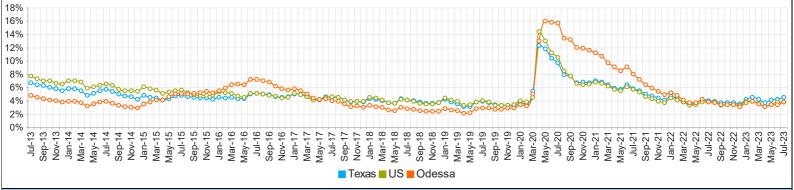

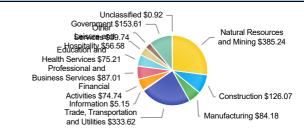
Historical Unemployment Rates



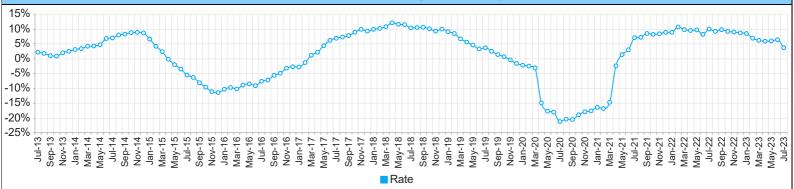
Employment by Size Class (1st Quarter 2023)



Wages by Industry (in millions) (1st Quarter 2023)

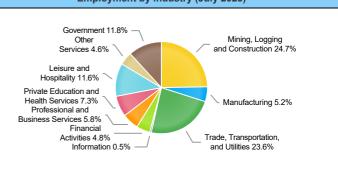


Annual Growth Rate Total Non-agricultural employment



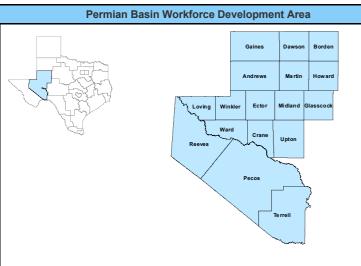

Employment by Industry (July 2023)



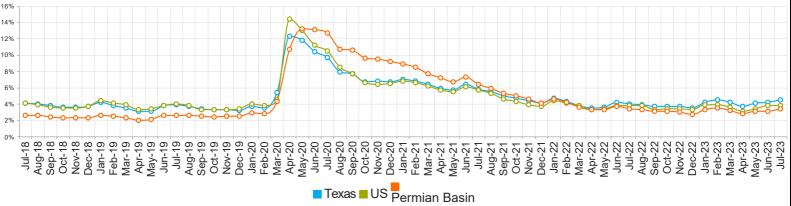




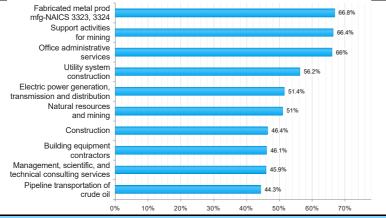

Projected Top Ten Fastest Growing Industries in WDA (% Growth 2020-2030) Fabricated metal prod

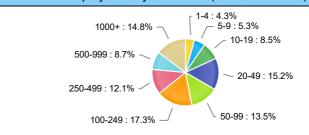

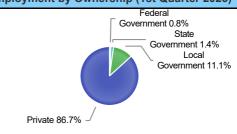
